

Adrian ALARILLA is a filmmaker and history PhD student at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa studying Filipino migration history. He helps organize the Southeast Asia by Seattle Film Festival and the annual Pagdiriwang Philippine Festival at the Seattle Center. He has co-written a chapter, "A Nation Imagined Differently: The Critical Impulse of 1950s Indonesian Cinema" in *Southeast Asia on Screen: from Independence to Financial Crisis (1945-1997)* (2020). His films, such as *Queer Transnational Love in the Time of Social Media and Globalization* (2017), have been shown in the US, Mexico, Cambodia, and the Philippines.
